Please could we remind you to call/email the office if your child is being collected by anyone other than the parent/carer otherwise the child

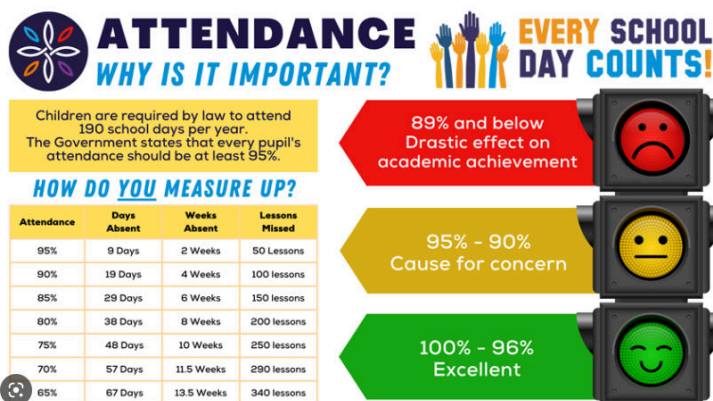

We are Geographers



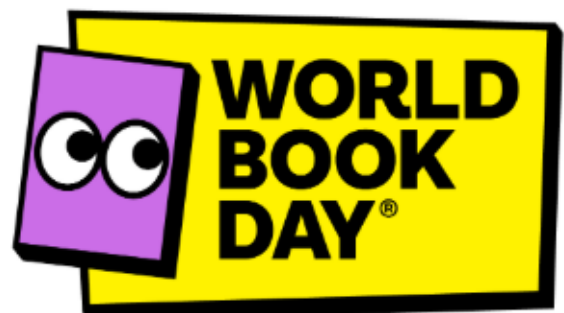

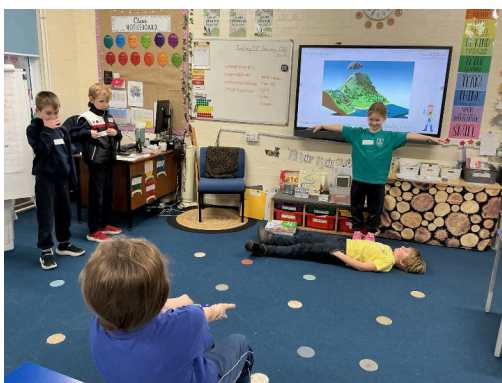

As Scientists, the children worked in small groups to bring the water cycle to life through drama. They planned, rehearsed and performed short skits, using mime to show each stage while a narrator told the story. The children named themselves as different parts of the water cycle, such as the Sun, water vapour, clouds and snow and shared their performances with the class.
