We walked to Capel Military Show with the children of Scott Broadwood. We enjoyed being paired with the children,

chatting to them on our walk. Firstly, we went to see tanks and we

saw a tank that was built to shoot down planes/bombers. After that, we saw the Russian army, where they showed us SMGs, submachine guns and grenades. They also showed us their WW2 gas masks and discussed why they wore them. The grenades that they showed us were all different. There was a grenade that you can throw when running forwards and a grenade that's explosion radius was bigger than a throw so you had to duck or run away! Then we got to go inside a tank! It was very cool - we saw how they control the gun, how it is driven, and we saw the hole in the top where someone can stand and shoot. We saw the huge army trucks being driven around in the arena; some had huge guns. In one of the trucks there was a husky dog which everyone wanted to see! We saw the American forces, who told us about different types of guns and showed us the scopes that they had. We also saw the Paratroopers, who are highly advanced fighters, who do 1 mission at a time and are also allowed any weapon they want! 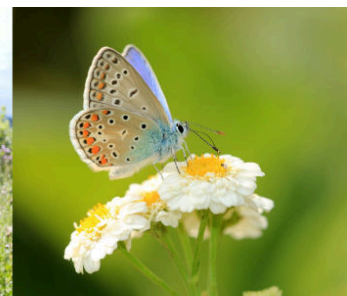
