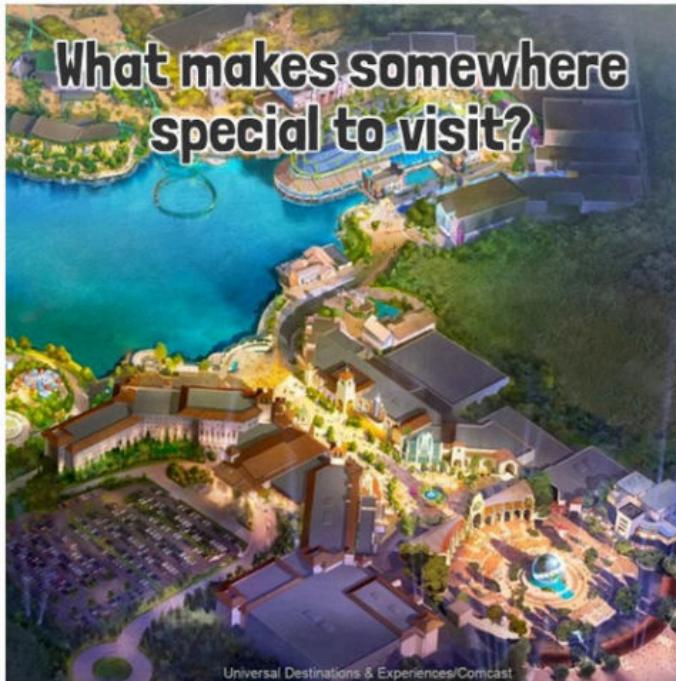

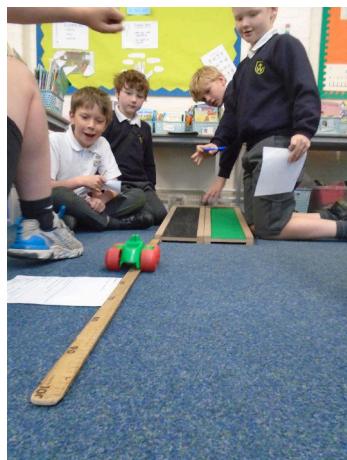


## We are Scientists



In our recent science investigation, students explored the fascinating concept of friction by examining how different surfaces affect the movement of a toy car. Using ramps, they kept the car constant and only changed the surface it moved on. By measuring how far and fast the car travelled on each surface, students discovered that smoother surfaces create less friction, allowing the car to move more easily, while rougher surfaces generate more friction, slowing the car down.

This hands-on experiment not only helped students understand the role of friction in everyday life but also allowed them to practice using scientific language to describe their observations and evaluate their findings.
