We are Philosophers

We are Athletes Paul Sturgess Visit

Last week Paul Sturgess, a former member of the world famous Harlem Globetrotters visited our school to give the children an insight into the basketball world. During the assembly, he showcased some of his basketball videos from his time in the NBA. He played for the Harlem Globetrotters

for three years, touring the world, and has starred in films including Avatar 2, Lord of the Rings and Fantastic Beasts. To end the assembly, Paul invited some pupils to



try out some basketball tricks which included 'around the worlds', spinning the ball on your finger, and various ways to pass the ball. After the assembly, Paul spent the remainder of the afternoon hosting sessions for each class. He taught the pupils how to dribble with the importance of keeping your head up, and dribbling with both hands. Paul is officially in the Guinness Book of Records as the tallest man in the UK. He spoke about the importance of accepting and embracing difference(s) in school and the wider society. This was an important message for our children.





We are Authors



As Authors, year 5 have been researching and writing biographies of people who have affected change in our world. This is closely linked to our work as Philosophers and Historians in our Enquiry 'How Do We All Live Together?'. We have shown great skills as Authors, using our understanding of chronology and the structure and tone of a biography to produce fantastic pieces of writing. Please ask your year 5 child who was the subject of their biography and how that person affected change in our world.



We had our half termly Carer Kids Club this week. The children enjoyed some time away from class and a sweet treat.

Our Home School Link Worker, Helen, invited Ellie from Surrey Young Carers to join the group today. Ellie kindly bought some games and some Loom Bands which the children went crazy for; the amount they produced with the Loom Bands in 30 minutes was quite something! 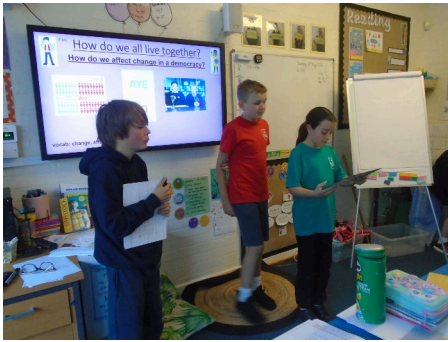
