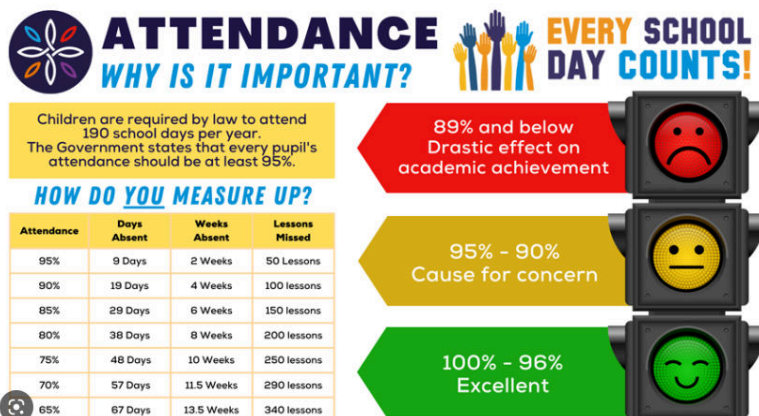
Safeguarding: Change of Collection Arrangements

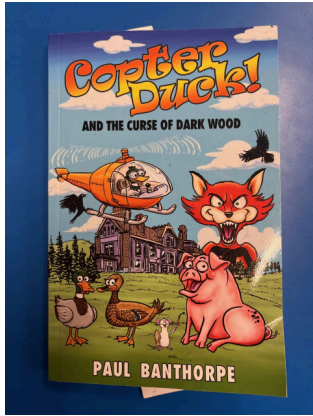
Attendance

The children have an exciting opportunity to get involved in three competitions run in conjunction with local visitor author, Paul Banthorpe. Here are the details:

1. Artwork competition: Draw a picture of any of the characters NOT already represented in the illustrations (eg. Messi and Ronaldo the Goats)
2. Write Weasel's Story! - What is his real name? How did he lose one of his eyes? What happens to Weasel in the future?
3. Introduce a new character to either Featherdown Farm or Dark Wood. This could include an illustration or a written description of their physical features **and** some key points on their character/ personality.

If your child would like to get involved, please submit **entries to Mrs Read (5/6SP) by Thursday 12th December.** A copy of the book, CopterDuck can be found in each classroom if you want to read it again or gain inspiration! Good luck!!!

As we know, enjoyment of reading is the single biggest predictor of children's future academic success and with that in mind, we encourage all children at The Weald to have two reading books with them each day: one colour-banded book and one 'reading for pleasure' book. The colour-banded book is an important part of becoming a fluent reader; children should read a book that is at an appropriate challenge level in order to allow them to be successful- success breeds success! A 'reading for pleasure' book can be anything that the child chooses themselves- it may be a graphic novel, a magazine, a picture book or even a recipe book! We want children to enjoy a mixture of both and we ask that you please record your child's reading in their reading record each day. Reading at home 5 times per week is absolutely essential to their success and we thank you for your support with this.

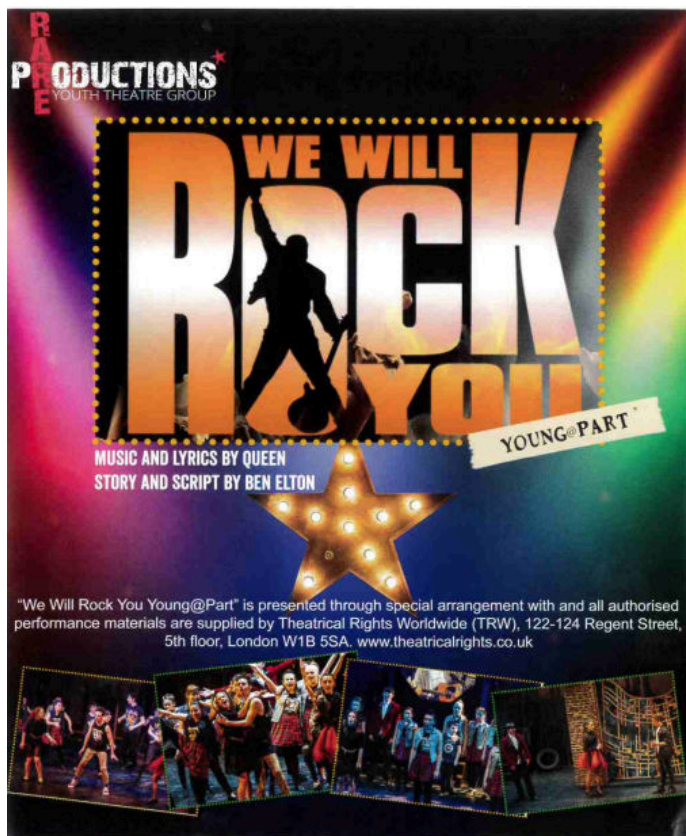

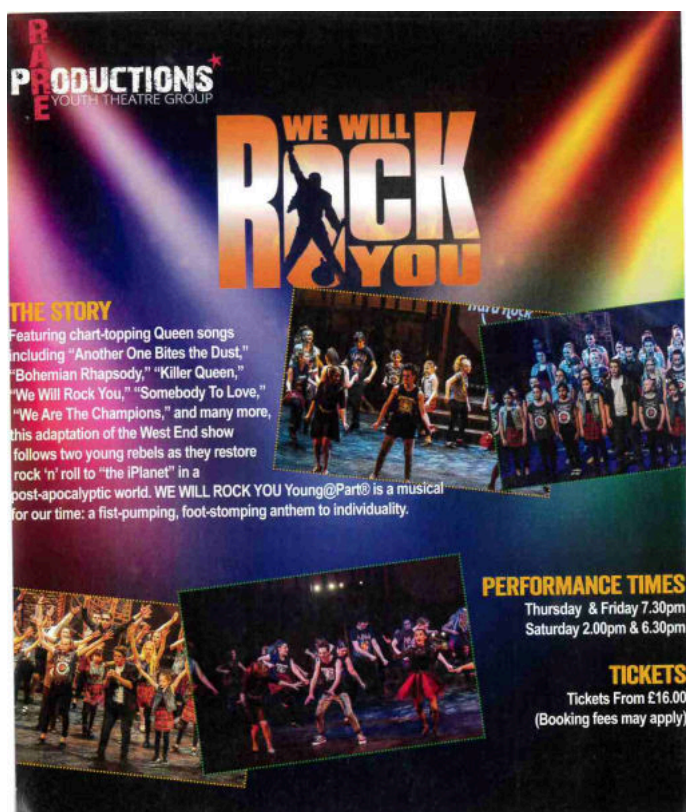
