

English: We are Authors

Weekly spellings: Spelling lists will be issued on a Friday and tested the following Friday. The spellings will link to the spelling patterns being taught in class and/or incorporate the Year 1-2 Common Exception Words or 3-4 Words. Please encourage your child to practise their spellings each evening.

Reading: Our class texts will be Charlotte's Web

How can you help at home? Listen to your child read five times a week; share a book or a text with your child and practice weekly spellings. Fill in the Reading Challenge form so that your child can earn certificates and possibly a prize.

Writing: We will be studying the book 'The Incredible Book Eating Boy'. Year 2s will be concentrating on punctuation and conjunctions, whereas Year 3/4 will vary sentence length, fronted adverbials and more sophisticated conjunctions.

Year 3/4: Who Stood Here Before Us?

Year 2: How Do Plants Grow?

Year 2: What Was Childhood Like In The Past?

Enquiry: We are Historians and Artists.

As Historians, we will be comparing and contrasting different historical periods using appropriate historical vocabulary. Children will be introduced to timelines and use them to place significant events in chronological order. Children will be encouraged to use artefacts, books and films to find out about their past.

As Artists this term, children will create a simple pinch pot with decorative features as well as sculpt clay into a head.

This half term, the children will be learning about shape, investigating properties and finding symmetry. The children will also be developing their understanding of the money system, making totals and finding change.

Year 3 will be revisiting written methods for multiplication and division whilst Year 4 will learn about the decimal system.

How you can help at home? Help your child apply their maths in practical situations. Practice telling the time; counting with coins; talking about fractions when cooking/ baking.
