

English: We are Authors

Writing: In writing this half term the children will be looking at the traditional tale 'Aladdin and the Enchanted Lamp'.

Through this unit, the children will continue to develop and use the correct formation of letters and joins. They will focus on the correct use of apostrophes and the subject/ verb agreement as well as paragraphs to move a story along. When editing, their focus will be the consistent use of tense.

Reading: Our class text will be 'My Friend Walter' by Michael Morpurgo

Reading- Reading sessions will focus on developing children's vocabulary and understanding through discussion-based learning. We will explore a range of fiction and non-fiction texts throughout the half term.

Spellings: - your child will be assigned a practice list made up of common exception words and the year 3/4 statutory word list on Spelling Shed on a bi-weekly basis as part of their home learning. Children will complete investigations in class exploring the etymology and morphology of words within the context of their own writing.

RE: We are Philosophers

What's the Bible's 'big story' and why is it like treasure for Christians?

In this unit the children will learn about the framework of the Bible at the centre of which is the birth, life, death & resurrection of Jesus.

PE: We are Athletes

Year 3 & 4:

Enquiry:

How can we find out about people in the past?

As Historians, we will be looking at chronology and how history is constructed. We will focus on which sources historians use to find out about the past. Children will use a range of historical sources to research a local individual. They will be Artists when they are studying portraits. For their challenge, they will be painting their own portrait of the local individual.

Homework

Children should read five times a week, practise spellings as well as practise times tables and mental maths three times a week.

Maths: We are Mathematicians

As we move through this term, we will be developing our understanding and skills related to adding and subtracting numbers. As part of our study of number questions, we will focus on different strategies and methods. Next, we'll be developing our multiplication skills by breaking up the facts into manageable chunks, making them concrete with a simple visual, so we can master the times tables.

How you can help at home? Help your child apply their maths in practical situations. Practice telling the time and simple addition and subtraction questions. Recalling of times tables is of great importance as it is the foundation for most mathematical concepts. Please support your child in the learning of their times tables through TTRS, other online games or reciting these.

Wellbeing: We are Philosophers

We will be looking at the story "Faruq and the Wiri Wiri Tree" by Sophia Payne and Sandhya Prabhat to understand how food and drink contributes to a 'balanced lifestyle'. We will also discuss what influences goals and dreams for the future.

French: We are Linguists

As linguists, we will be looking at finding out about France as country: foods, tourist attractions, map work. The children will then move on to learning about Christmas and French traditions.

Computing: We are Engineers

We will be developing our skills of photo editing. The children will learn how to edit or distort a picture and how this links with 'Fake News'.
