

English: We are Authors

Writing: This half term, we will be studying a non-fiction text ‘The Street beneath our Feet’ to help inspire our non-fiction narrative writing.

Reading: Our class texts will be reading ‘Pebble in my Pocket’ by Meredith Hooper and ‘The Firework Makers Daughter’ by Phillip Pullman.

Weekly spellings: Spelling lists will be issued on a Friday and assessed the following Friday. The spellings will link to the spelling patterns being taught in class and/or incorporate the year 3-4 Common Exception Words. Please encourage your child to practise their spellings each evening.

How can you help at home? Listen to your child read five times a week; share a book or a text with your child and practice their weekly spellings. Fill in the Reading Challenge form so that your child can earn certificates and possibly win a prize.

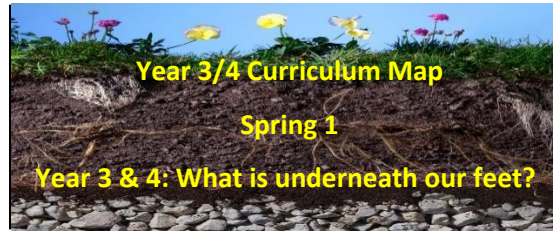

This enquiry will focus on a variety of geographical and scientific concepts. This year the focus will be on volcanoes and earthquakes. Children will also investigate what lies beneath our feet.

Children should read five times a week, practise spellings as well as practise times tables and mental maths.

This half term, the children will be developing their understanding and skills related to Multiplication and Division including reasoning and problem solving using these operations.

We will then move on to Length and Perimeter – looking at measuring using metres, centimetres and millimetres and how to calculate the perimeter of different shapes

How you can help at home? Help your child apply their maths in practical situations. Practice telling the time; times tables and recognising numbers around them.

It is really important for the children to be able to recall their times tables. Please use online games and practical fun ways at home to encourage your child to have these facts at their fingertips!
