

English: We are Readers and Authors

This half term, we will finishing the factual tour writing based on the water cycle and the book 'Once Upon a Raindrop'. Following the conclusion of that, we will then do a non-fiction newspaper report. We will look to develop appropriate literary devices for the genre being studied.

Weekly spellings: Spelling lists will be issued on a Friday and tested on the following Friday. The spellings will link to the spelling patterns being taught in class. Please encourage your child to practise their spellings using Spelling Shed and to learn the words from the statutory word lists.

Reading: For our class text, we will be reading Song of the Dolphin Boy by Elizabeth Laird and Running Wild by Michael Morpurgo

How can you help at home? Listen to your child read at least five times a week - share a book or a text with your child and discuss the text, for example talk about characters and reasons for their behaviour. It is useful to compare with other texts they have read too. Please record in their reading record.

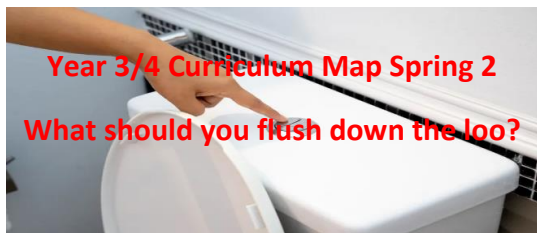

Enquiry: Scientist, Geographer and Engineer

What should you flush down the loo?

As Scientists, children will begin by investigating how plants and animals can be classified and creating their own classification charts. As Geographers, we will reflect on how humans impact on environments and can cause a danger to other living creatures, specifically looking at waste around water and plastics. Finally, as Engineers, we will assess products and consider how they could reduce plastic pollution.

At the end of the Spring term we will have a two day block entitled "What is Creativity?" This links to our school values and will give the children an opportunity to explore Creativity.

French: We are Linguists

As linguists the children will learn how talk about their local area and facilities and compare this with France.

Maths: We are Mathematicians

This half term Years 3 and 4 will work on length and perimeter and then start fractions. Year 4 will continue with fractions then study length and perimeter and start decimals.

Across the phase, we will continue to develop further the children's language as mathematicians and encourage children to use this language in their explanations.

Children will also tackle mathematical problem solving and reasoning challenges, where they will need to show a positive mind-set and resilience.

How you can help at home? Help your child apply their maths in practical situations by multiplying and dividing in the home. In terms of length and perimeter, it is useful to talk about the size of items in terms of mm, cm or m. Please continue to work on timetable facts. This can be done by using Timetable Rockstars or other methods.

Wellbeing: We are Philosophers

This half term, Years 3 and 4 will be focusing on friendships and understanding risks and dares through the story of 'I dare you' by Reece Wykes.

Computing: We are Engineers

The children will explore the links between computers and other devices both digital and non-digital and learn about computer networks.
