

English: We are Readers and Authors

Writing: We will be exploring the picture book, 'Varmints' by Helen Ward and Mark Craste. This will be the stimulus for our narrative writing this half term. Our Non-fiction unit will support our enquiry work – we will be exploring and writing biographies.

Reading: Our class reader will be The Last Bear by Hannah Gold. We will also explore related texts such as The Lorax.

Spelling: In class, we continue to focus on irregular verbs and will be practising these daily. We will continue weekly dictation and begin to focus on morphological spelling patterns.

Handwriting: cursive letter strings and statutory words.

How can you help at home? Read, hear your child read aloud and discuss what they are reading. Spelling lists will be issued on a fortnightly basis. These words come from the statutory Year 5/6 list and we require children to practise these. Please talk through the spelling list and help your child to understand their meaning and use the words in context.

RE: We are Philosophers

Christianity: Our thematic unit this half term is 'Is Life a Journey?'. The purpose of this unit is to help pupils understand that the journey of life is marked by milestones and choices and that their beliefs, actions, and important people in their lives will influence the direction of this journey.

Enquiry

States of being: Historian, Geographer and Engineer

This enquiry focuses largely on environmental issues around reducing your carbon footprint. The enquiry is also underpinned by the theme of legacy and with transition to secondary school coming up for our Year 6's, we will be exploring what footprint learners will be leaving at the school.

How can you help at home? Discuss with your child different ways to reduce your carbon footprint- perhaps you could set yourself a family challenge to reduce, reuse and recycle!

Maths: We are Mathematicians

Both Year 5 and 6 will work to consolidate our understanding of shape, statistics, ratio and algebra.

How can you help at home?

Ensure quick recall of number facts and mental calculation are practised and used in context. E.g. Adding running totals, calculating change and offers. Continue to practice times tables at home as these are the foundations of many concepts within maths. Encourage maths-based games at home:

Computing: We are Engineers

We will be developing our knowledge of selection by revisiting how conditions can be used in programs and then learning how the If... Then... Else structure can be used to select different outcomes depending on whether a condition is true or false.

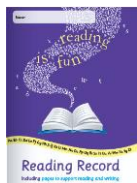
Weekly Non-Negotiables
