We are Musicians


Composer of the half term



Winchester Science Museum

Important Attendance Notice from Surrey CC

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

What does a Home School Link Worker do?

Our Home School Link Worker is here to:

- Offer advice and guidance on parenting, routines, behaviour, and emotional wellbeing
- Support families going through difficult times, such as bereavement, separation, or housing issues
- Help improve attendance and punctuality
- Signpost families to local services, such as food banks, counselling, or financial advice
- Be a listening ear when you need someone to talk to

How can they help your child?

By working closely with families, teachers, and outside agencies, the Home School Link Worker helps remove any barriers that might affect a child's learning or happiness at school.

How can you get in touch?

You can contact Helen by calling the school office or speaking to your child's teacher. She is always happy to meet with parents and carers in a friendly, non-judgemental way.


