In the news this week

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the United Nations (UN), an international organisation founded after the Second World War in 1945, to help countries work together and prevent future conflicts. Today, 193 nations are members, and the UN works on issues like peacekeeping, human rights, health, and climate change. Leaders and communities around the world are reflecting on how important working together is in solving global problems.

Things to talk about at home ...

- Why do you think countries made the decision to work together?
- What problems today do you believe countries need to solve together? Ask others at home what they think.
- Come up with different ways we can be 'peacekeepers' in our own families, schools, or communities.

The existing group members were able to tell the new children what the club is about and why we meet. Our Home School Link Worker, Helen Young, runs the group, she lets the group know that they all have something in common but doesn't highlight the reason each of them is there. The children can talk if they want to but equally, they can just enjoy the fun and games and listen.

Young Carers



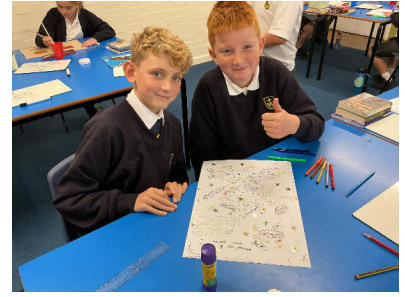
We had our first Carer Kids Young Carer Club of the school year last week. Some new and old faces were happy to have a bit of fun outside of class and enjoy a sweet treat.

We are Philosophers



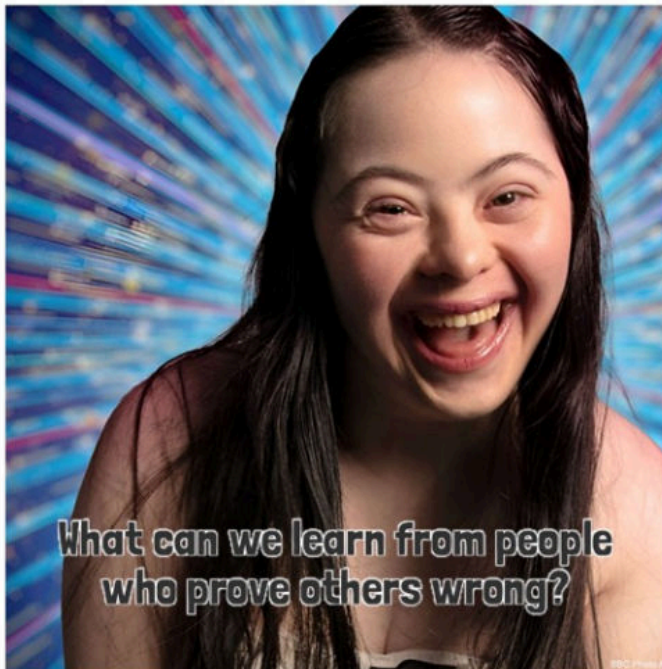

Ellie Goldstein, a 23-year-old model from Ilford, has been announced as a contestant on Strictly Come Dancing. She is the first person with Down's syndrome to take part in a full series of the show, having already made history as the first model with Down's syndrome to appear on the cover of British Vogue. Ellie says she's excited for the challenge and hopes to show that people can do amazing things, even when others don't expect them to.

Things to talk about at home ...

- Have you ever seen Strictly Come Dancing on TV? Do you enjoy watching programmes that show competitions? Ask others at home whether they do.
- Why do you think Ellie decided to take part? Is it something you would like to take part in?
- Can you remember a time when you were told you couldn't do something? E.g., finish a puzzle or reach the top of a climbing frame. Share how you felt, and what happened.

Celebration of Differences Assembly

Last week we came together during an assembly to celebrate differences within our school community. Three amazing children talked about the challenges that they face every day in their lives and the resilience that they have fostered through this.

Thank you to **Jasmine**, who spoke with confidence and pride about her younger brother, Eddie, who was born with CHARGE syndrome. Being deaf and blind, Jasmine talked about communicating with him and how she is learning BSL (British Sign Language) alongside adults! The

children asked really thoughtful questions, and Jasmine did brilliantly articulating her answers well - for instance,

she spoke about Eddie 'mapping' a space after a child asked about his movement and communication. Watch this space for more information about **Jasmine's BSL Club** coming to school very soon!



Another thank you to **Charlie** who spoke bravely about

his ongoing challenges living with Type 1 Diabetes. He shared with us a really informative video and gave children time to answer questions about his life and how this impacts him every single day. We have a greater understanding of how his insulin pump works and why this is vital for him to



have. He proved that having Diabetes won't stop him from aiming high and achieving what he puts his mind to!

Finally, it was great to invite **Joseph** up to talk to everyone about how Cerebral Palsy affects his life. He was able to show his splint to everyone in school and

allow more questions about this from our community about what his splint does to help his leg and



about his countless hospital visits over the years. There is nothing stopping Joseph from being active and proving that CP will not stop him!

We shared a final prayer of thanks:

Dear God,

Thank You for the beauty in our differences, each life a unique reflection of Your love.

Bless those who have challenges such as those who are deaf, blind, diabetic, living with cerebral palsy or learning challenges—may they feel seen and valued by their communities around them.

Unite us in love and respect, that we may honour every person as a sacred gift.

We are Engineers



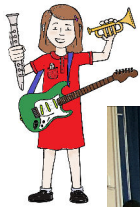

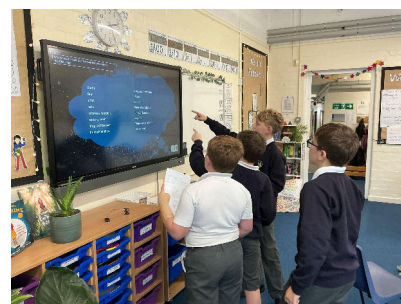
We are Athletes

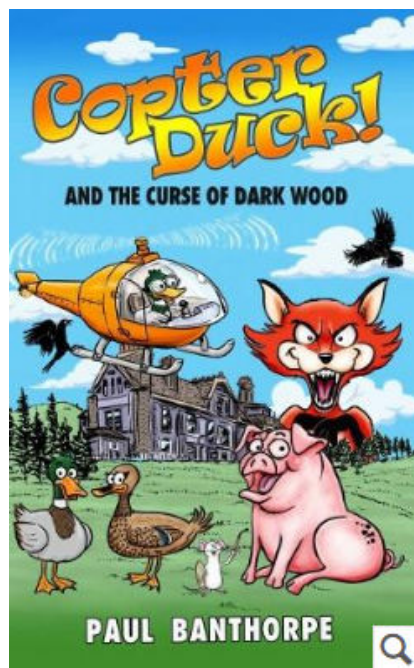
